

TO REACH PEOPLE FOR JESUS CHRIST & TOGETHER BECOME MORE LIKE HIM



In 1976, Henry Blackaby and Claude King first published the book, EXPERIENCING GOD: Knowing and Doing the Will of God. The popularity of this book led to the development of a 13-week study course by the same title, which was published in 1990. Since that time, millions of lives and countless churches around the world have been radically impacted by the seven realities which are at the heart of this study. In 2000, on the occasion of the tenth anniversary of publication, more than three million of the workbooks had been distributed, which is now published in 47 different languages.

In 1999, Lifeway Christian Resources, under the leadership of Mark Blankenship, approached Mr. Blackaby about a musical which could effectively communicate the seven realities within the study. They needed to find someone who could be the lead on this project who had been impacted by the Experiencing God study. The search led them to composer, Gary Rhodes, who had served as a college summer missionary at Faith Baptist Church, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada, where Henry Blackaby pastored for 12 years. Rhodes partnered with Claire Cloninger, who was also impacted by the Experiencing God study, and together they wrote EXPERIENCING GOD, THE MUSICAL, which premiered in 2000.

Since that time, this musical has been used to introduce the study to many people and to reinforce the truths of the study which had already been a part of their lives.

Sunday morning, April 22, the Sanctuary Choir and Celebration Orchestra along with children, youth, soloists, and narration will present this wonderful expression of worship.





LEARNING FROM THE DARKNESS...

It is fascinating that Easter and April Fool's Day occur on the same day this year. At least fascinating for a preacher. Even though the women were weeping as they trudged to the tomb, a sermon title could be, "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Tomb." How about a skit where the women return from the tomb to tell the disciples, "Jesus is alive." In disbelief, the disciples respond with, "O sure, yeah...and April Fools to you too."

On Friday, the world was laughing as this King of the Jews hung from a cross. But not so fast.... On Easter, God has the last laugh on Caesar, Pilate, the Chief Priests, and even death itself. The joke is on us who doubted how God can take a cross and turn it into Easter hope, or take nails and use those wounds to heal us.

The news that Jesus was headed to Galilee on that first Easter seemed like foolishness, even to His closest followers. There were no "high-fives." Yet, we have always had this foolish and comical God. Frederick Buechner says: "Old Zacchaeus climbs up a sycamore tree a crook and climbs down a saint. The Apostle Paul sets out a hatchet man for the Pharisees and comes back a fool for Christ."

God is the master of the impossible. God takes this Paul, a hard-core legalist, and he becomes the messenger of amazing grace. The Apostle knew this God looked like the "Lord of Fools" as He turns the tables on the Corinthians: "For the message of the cross (and Easter) is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us being saved it is the power of God."

It is Easter, no fooling! Perhaps we have missed the foolish message of the resurrection. Easter is more than a comforting story that everything will work out. John Ortberg says, "The first response to Easter was fear as the women ran from the tomb with their dresses hiked

up to their knees. None of the gospel accounts have Jesus or the angels saying, 'Now you don't have to worry about death anymore."

What Jesus does is give His followers a mission. When Jesus tells the disciples to meet Him in Galilee, He is saying there is work to be done in spreading God's movement. He is saying, I need you and will use you, which sounds pretty foolish. In re-examining the message of Easter, Ortberg contends "On that Sunday the disciples lives didn't get safer; their lives got a lot more dangerous. What got released on Sunday was not comfort..., but a calling."

On Easter it was more than the assurance of life after death, but life after birth. Don't make the mistake of making Jesus and Easter only a ticket to the afterlife. What invaded the world on Easter was hope. Ortberg describes this Easter hope as the "Hope that called people to die to self; die to selfishness, greed and fear; to die to the lesser self so a greater self might be born and raised in us."

Garrett Fiddler wrote about the irony of the cross as a piece of jewelry, "Really the cross does not belong on the Christian; the Christian belongs to the cross." The resurrection hope is the hope which lies on the other side of dying. Paul said, "We are a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come." Easter is living out this hope as fools for Christ, being His foolish presence in the world.

FINDING YOUR PLACE

RIGHT THINKING "Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is -- His good, pleasing and perfect will." Romans 12:2 NIV

Transformation comes with right thinking about God, about others, and about ourselves. Knowing God through His Word, the Bible, and the indwelling Holy Spirit is how we KNOW God rightly.
