The team is comprised of members who have a variety of professional backgrounds, but more importantly, they love our church and want what is best for the future of First Baptist Church.

So, on Sunday morning, April 14, during the Sunday school hour, there will be a presentation by the feasibility for all the Sunday school classes from the youth up. We have already informed each of the teachers and directors of these classes about this important presentation. We firmly believe in Bible study and try very hard to not disrupt the teaching of God's word. However, this seemed the best way to have everyone present in one During the presentation, led by Feasibility setting. Team Chair Larry Smith, you will hear a report about the condition of the property, the current ideas if we were to purchase it, and the long-range possibilities for ministry. Immediately following the presentation will be our wonderful Palm Sunday service. In order to accommodate those who might be out of town Sunday

morning, but more importantly those who teach in our preschool and children's areas, we will repeat the presentation at 4:00 p.m. in the dining room that day. Then at 5:00 p.m., there will be a town hall meeting for the purpose of discussing what was presented that morning and a time to answer any and all guestions you might have. In fact, there will be cards available prior to the Sunday morning presentation for you to write your questions on. This will give the team time to make sure all the questions are addressed and answered. Then, if a second town hall meeting is needed, one could be held on Wednesday, April 24, to clarify any outstanding questions. On Sunday, April 28, during the morning worship service we will vote on the proposal. This vote will be by written ballot and we will make arrangements for absentee voting for those who are unable to attend that day.

Please be in prayer for the feasibility team as they finish their work, for 1st Christian Church as they go through this time of transition, and for our vision of what might or might not be as we move forward doing Kingdom work now and into the future.

Dr. Phil Christopher Senior Pastor



William Willimon served as the Methodist Bishop overseeing churches and working with pastors in Alabama. The teenage son of one of his pastors took his life just before Holy Week. Trying to offer comfort to the pastor and his family Willimon asked, "Is there anything I can do for you?" The pastor replied, "Would you come to my church and preach the Easter sermon? I'll be in no condition to preach it myself."

Willimon says, "My first reaction to his request was a huge sense of inadequacy – is it possible to speak a good word in the face of such horror and grief?" He wondered if any preacher is in a condition to preach it by himself or herself. Willimon says, "As I thought about it, I realized Easter is always preaching to a hurting congregation who think death and pain have the last word." So on that Easter Sunday, he told the story. He preached defiantly against defeat, the devil, disbelief, and declaring in the tragedies of life, *"Christ is risen."*

Every Easter sermon is preached to people who are in danger of thinking death or for some, dementia wins. Those disciples on that Friday were in no condition to preach a word of hope like that grieving pastor who had lost his son. We should not be surprised that a lot of people show up for Easter, but for them, it really isn't Easter.

The Easter message certainly proclaims the hope of the resurrection hymn: "Jesus has opened paradise." The resurrection of Jesus assures us we all will go to heaven. Yet, have we missed something about the hope of Easter? Easter is so much more than rescuing us from the enemy of death. Easter is not just about the future, but the "here and now." Read the gospel accounts of the resurrection. He sent them on a mission and encountered people where they lived and worked. He rescues us from having to live with no hope in the present.

I mentioned in a sermon the woman whose husband left her after forty-three years of marriage for another woman.

Can you imagine the hurt? The same year her forty-oneyear-old son was tragically killed in a car accident. She is struggling. Yet she lives caring for others and with such faith. You want proof of the resurrection? It isn't the empty tomb. She is the evidence of the resurrection. Christ is alive. She has been set free in this world as she lives with hope in the "here and now" in the midst of such grief.

Have you ever thought the words, "Jesus is risen" can be frightening? He will show up anywhere. The other disturbing words we often miss at Easter is: "Go tell!" The



Lord is back and commissions us to do His work. We are now His agents of Easter hope. The real result of Easter is the church, a community of people who are called to "Go tell He is alive and set loose in the world." During this Easter season, we are considering the purchase of First Christian Church. This is a big step. Could it be during this Easter season God is giving us a new opportunity to expand our ministries and "Go tell"? As we approach this decision, I invite you into a season of spiritual discernment. As you consider this proposal, ask: "Is there anything you need to set aside so you can be open to what God wants?" Pray for God's Will and leading in this decision by daily praying: "Nothing more; Nothing else; Nothing less" than what God wants for the future of our church. Let us be open to ways we can tell the world the risen Christ is back and at work through us.

Let us "Go tell!"

Flowering of the Cross

For many years, we have had a tradition on Easter morning of the children coming forward and Flowering the Cross during the morning service. This is such a beautiful depiction of the resurrection and the beauty that it brings to our lives.

When we arrive in the sanctuary Easter morning we will see what many deem an ugly cross, which reminds us of the terrible and ugly death Jesus suffered on the prior Friday. As we look at the ugliness of the cross, we are reminded of the ugliness and sin in our lives which Jesus so willing died for. During the service, as the children flower the cross, we will see the transformation into a beautiful cross which represents the beauty of Jesus' resurrection and the new life we have because of His sacrifice.

We will continue the tradition of having a cross outside on the front porch of the sanctuary and allowing people to bring their own flowers to decorate. We ask that you bring flowers, bought or from your own garden, to help depict the beauty of Easter in the transforming of the cross. We do recommend that the stems be cut 4"-6" prior to bringing them.

INTRODUCING CITY LIGHT CULINARY ACADEMY

City Light Culinary Academy is working to break the cycle of poverty through culinary training for homeless and disadvantaged individuals in Abilene and the surrounding areas.

Classes begin soon! On May 13 we will have our first cohort under the leadership and training of our new Director of Operations/Chef Trainer, Kayleen Mills!

Kayleen comes to us with experience in food service operations, teaching, and management. She has an Associate of Applied Science in Culinary Arts from Le Cordon Bleu - The Cooking and Hospitality Institute of Chicago. We feel very blessed to have her as a part of this ministry!

Summary of Curriculum:

Phase 1 (Weeks 1-4): Gain Food Handler's Certificate, introduce knife skills, equipment and utensils, salad prep, meat and vegetables cutting, bulk entrées, healthy communication, teamwork, and goal setting.

Phase 2 (Weeks 5-8): Product and equipment ID, food prep, knife skills, culinary math, stock, sauces, soup, portioning, entrée prep, customer service, choosing to create a new future, and goal setting.

Phase 3 (Weeks 9-12): Knife skills, catering trays and complex presentation, stocks, sauces, thickeners, kitchen brigade and line work, cumulative culinary final, dealing with setbacks, assertiveness, and job readiness.

Kayleen has already had the opportunity to use her teaching skills when the young T.B. Maston Scholars from Texas Baptist Universities visited City Light March 24-25. This visit was in association of the Maston Lectures at Logsdon Seminary. City Light had the privilege of telling our City Light/FBC Abilene story about how we love our city and how we are moving towards empowering people to move out of poverty. Our first step is the Culinary Academy and we'll soon add volunteer case management to go along with our crisis ministry, community meals, and Big A children's ministry. These students were able to take advantage of the knife skill lessons (with no injuries) which our Culinary Academy will soon be teaching and experienced what our students will be learning. Be watching for new cooking classes which will be offered to FBC and our community in the future through our Culinary Academy. Kayleen Mills will help you learn how put some new culinary math into your recipes and cooking techniques. Be watching for more information about these classes. However, what you can do now is pray for our new academy. Pray for the right students to be involved, pray for Kayleen's leadership, pray for our new City Light Board helping to give direction to the new endeavor, pray for people's lives to be different because of this training and investment into their lives, pray for our Abilene restaurants to invest in our students who will be involved in our academy. Thank you for being a church who is willing to think outside the charity box and empower people to make positive changes in their lives.
