Through the generosity of First Baptist Church People, I, along with John Moore, Charlie Jowers, Steve Steed, Dante Steed, Shaun McCleese, Greg Young, Beth Young, Jorge Flores, and Tim Griffin were given the privilege of meeting a deserving family in Mission, TX and starting a new home for them.



Just for the record, it was brutally hot, and our very long days started before the sun's. Did I complain? You bet I did! I whined as I ate my breakfast while it was dark outside, as we loaded the van in 100% humidity, as we drove to the home site, and as we unloaded our tools and ice chests from the van and trailer – but that's where the whining ended (with the possible exception for the recurring torture of having to walk around a burnt orange t.u. decorated motor home every day!). Meeting and working alongside the Ordaz family changed my attitude completely.

It was truly an ecumenical endeavor that included FBC, Abilene, an old partnership with Buckner Family Ministries, and new friends who worship at a Methodist church in Portland, TX and have been building houses in the Valley for many years. I have been part of other projects where there were clearly too many "chiefs" and not enough "Indians," but the balance was just right this time. There were a few like me who know which end of a hammer to use on the nail and there were a few with many years of experience and a wealth of knowledge they were willing and eager to share, and a few in the middle. The pictures you have seen show the amazing transformation that happened in just 4 days: from a foundation to a completely framed and roofed house. The spirit of cooperation which led to that transformation could have come from no place other than the Holy Spirit.

All this took place along the southern U.S. border which is in the news and in political discussions every day. Each night we met together to review the day, pray, and prepare for the next. In one of those meetings, we all agreed we had not felt unsafe or insecure at any time and we were there to serve the Lord by serving those who had come to our country and state simply hoping for a better life for themselves and their children.

We were not there to preach, to hand out tracts, or even to invite the Ordaz family to church - we were there to meet a need. We encountered a family of 3, one a recent high school graduate with a dream of college and a psychology degree, living in a one-bedroom house with their washing machine in the yard. We were there to build a three-bedroom house, all of 960 square feet, with washer connections indoors, in the name of Christ. Some call it the "social gospel," I call it obedience.

Thanks for sending us. What a tremendous blessing it was for the Ordaz family and for each one of us.


















WELCOME TO First Friends PRESCHOOL Katie Palmer, FFP Director

BROADCAST MEDIA VIEWERSHIP REPORT APRIL – JUNE 2024

Each Sunday, the worship service of FBC is broadcast on television and streamed on social media. A delayed and edited version of the previous week's service is broadcast on KTXS from 10:00–10:30 a.m. and a live broadcast of the current service is on the CW channel 10:30 – 11:30 a.m. Additionally, the entire service is live-streamed on Facebook, YouTube, Boxcast, and our website. Viewership is measured by the Nielsen Rating System, Google Analytics, Boxcast Analytics, and Facebook views. The broadcast requires 11 to 12 volunteers each Sunday. If you are interested, this ministry needs volunteers.

We get demographic information such as age, location, and average viewing times. The 35-64-year-old age group are those who watch most often. These statistics are reported by source, viewership, households, and individual viewers and averaged for the second quarter of 2024.
