SPECIAL EVENTS



MCALLEN MISSION TRIP PEPOPT

I was excited to be a part of the team called for the work/mission trip to McAllen this year. Having participated in three previous mission trips involving construction projects in Mexico, I was somewhat familiar with the labor involved, and I felt like I could contribute to our team.

I rode with Tim Griffin, and we arrived in McAllen in time to gather with the rest of our team to get acquainted and learn about the goals we hoped to accomplish. John Moore also told us about the Hernandez Family, a mother and her two sons, who would become the residents of the home we would be working on during our time in McAllen.

Since the pier and beam foundation was already in place, our team would work to complete the prepping, placing, and connecting sections that created the outside walls. We would also install windows according to the plans. Once the outside walls were done, we would move on to framing the walls to create the different rooms within the house. Then, the team would be responsible for setting and securing the attic trusses and then adding the roof decking so the next volunteer group could roof the house. One last job for our team would be to build a deck or back porch with steps from the deck to the ground. After

John presented our construction goals, our team entered into a time of prayer and then dispersed for the evening so we could get started early the next morning.

Our FBC team partnered with Buckner Ministries to build this house for the Hernandez family. The FBC team consisted of: John Moore, Tim Griffin, Danny Haddox, Shaun McCleese (project foreman), and Myles, Sara, Eliot, and Arthur Werntz. We were joined by Steve Steed (project foreman) of Stephenville, Jorge Flores of Portland, TX, and John Hunt and Ben Milam of Waco. John is a Buckner employee, and he was joined by Pedro Gonzalez, and Xylina(Celina) Rotramel also with Buckner. Shaun parents, Stu and Gail McCleese also from Portand, TX joined us on Saturday and Sunday to lend a hand.

Once we arrived at the site on Friday morning, everyone began to find where they felt they could contribute; there were jobs for everyone. Fortunately, the weather conditions were bearable with the high temperature of 93 degrees on all our workdays with a good breeze present each day. By the end of the first day, the team had three of four walls in place.

On Saturday, the team secured into place all of the inside framing for walls before raising the last wall into place. As the

afternoon closed in, the team not only finished raising the last wall, but also installed scaffolding along the front and back sides of the house so we could then place trusses on top.

On Sunday morning, the trusses were put into place and secured, and by lunch, decking had been nailed into place on one half of the house. By late afternoon, the roof top decking and the back porch decking were both completed. Our team had pulled together and worked hard to complete all of our goals in just three days.

To show their gratitude for our work, the Hernandez family found ways to help as well. The boys worked on the construction, and Mrs. Hernandez, a widow, provided delicious treats and lunches to the team.

Let me take this opportunity to tell the church how impressed the overall team was with John Moore and his excellent preparation for the McAllen mission/work trip. FBC is fortunate to have John leading the mission opportunities in our city, our state, our country, and our world. I hope others will consider joining on future mission projects. You will be blessed more than you can imagine.

Thankfully, this year we had beautiful cloud coverage each day, but far superior were the connections with the members of the FBC construction team. Buckner staff, and the family whose home we worked on. My boys were so fortunate to have a group of men and women that displayed what it means to be the hands and feet of Christ in a hurting world, while also being able to contribute in meaningful, tangible ways themselves. They have both asked to go back and build a new home for another family and want to learn Spanish so that they can talk to the people we meet! They also asked for an air compressor and nail gun, but I think we will wait on that one!!

In a time when we often feel at a loss for being able to make a difference in the world, consider what it could look like for your own family to serve and grow together. Like Sarah, I grew up going on various mission trips. From soup kitchens in New York City to building cement slabs in Mexico; participating with my family on mission trips was just part of the deal. One of the things I appreciated about it the most was that it allowed me to get out of my own head and to practically serve someone in need. In serving alongside my parents, I was able to learn what it means to give of not just one's money, but one's time in service to God.



We've been waiting until our kids were old enough to fully participate, and this was finally the year. We'd been hearing about the McAllen trip for years, and it was nothing short of fantastic. Our trip drew folks from Abilene, Stephenville, Waco, and McAllen together for three full days of construction. And in just three days, our group was able to go from a wooden foundation to a fully-raised house, ready for electrical and plumbing to go in.

While driving back from San Antonio, exhausted from raising rafters and from the McAllen heat, I thought about how long I've wanted these kinds of trips to be a part of my kids' lives. There's nothing glamorous about the drive from Abilene to McAllen; once you get to San Antonio, you're only half way there. But the experience of giving our labor on behalf of someone else as a family, of giving our time for a family in need: these are, I think, signs of the kingdom of God.

Buckner International is a historic Baptist institution which works on behalf of families and children across the globe. The work it does in McAllen—helping families with housing in one of the poorest parts of the border area—is one of the many excellent things it does. It's my hope that next year, many more folks from FBC can come taste and see what God is doing in South Texas.





MINISTRY OF COUNSELING AND ENRICHMENT

Whether a student entering Kindergarten for the first time, a teacher starting their 43rd first day of school, or someone who has not sat in a classroom in longer than a decade; August evokes a sense of change. Change can be anticipated or greatly feared. One thing is certain, maintaining change can be very difficult.

Our priority at the Ministry of Counseling and Enrichment (MOCE) is three-fold: 1) help people identify the changes they would like to make 2) equip them to make changes and 3) encourage maintenance of desired changes. Pray that our community will have the courage to seek help when needed. Please also pray for people who are seeking help to be able to step into and maintain the changes they are desiring.

THERAPIST SPOTLIGHT: Jennifer Smothermon

Changes are happening at the Ministry of Counseling! Jennifer Smothermon has been named MOCE's Clinical Director. As Clinical Director, Jennifer gains the title that matches the work she has been doing for over two decades. This work includes supervision for both clinical students in their graduate programs and LPC (Licensed Professional Counselor) and LMFT (Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist) Associates who are working toward licensure. She will also provide leadership and wisdom to the Interim Director and to MOCE to ensure clients gain the best access to care as is possible. Jennifer will continue to see clients at MOCE while also serving in other capacities in our therapeutic community.

Jennifer has worked at Ministry of Counseling and Enrichment in various capacities since April of 1998. She is a Licensed Professional Counselor, Supervisor, Licensed Marriage & Family Therapist, Supervisor, and a Registered Play Therapist, Supervisor. Jennifer has also been MOCE's Director of Development since August of 2000. In this capacity, Jennifer has written grants that have helped to provide MOCE's therapeutic playground, the Therapeutic Expressive Family Room, and grant dollars to ensure that Ministry of Counseling and Enrichment can fulfill its mission of reaching those seeking counseling regardless of their background or ability

to pay.

Help me in congratulating Jennifer as her many gifts, contributions, and sacrifices are getting recognized this year.

Earlier this year, Jennifer received the Outstanding Supervisor Award from the Texas Association for Marriage and Family Therapy.
