

GIVE HOPE FIRST REPORT

At the First Baptist Church Annual Thanksgiving Dinner on Sunday, November 24, the co-leaders of the Give Hope Campaign gave the first report about the campaign. After Callie Harris gave a brief recap of the campaign, Evan Harris announced the total pledged to this point. As of the start of the dinner, the total pledged was \$4,374,965. However, there were numerous cards turned in at the dinner and then several more returned to the church office on Monday morning. So, as of Tuesday, November 26 at noon, the update pledge total is \$4,417,685 with 158 cards having been returned.

So, the obvious question is where do we go from here? As Evan reminded us at the dinner, the Give Hope Building Team can now begin planning for the next step in the process. They have had an initial meeting, but will really get busy now. Developing a scope of work will be the first task they will set out to accomplish and will do so with the understanding of where the campaign stands.

We also know that several folks have not had a chance to return their card, as well as some contacts which had been made but it would be after the first of the year before they could talk specifics. So, we are very encouraged about this first report and know that it will continue to grow as others continue to be involved. If you have not had the opportunity to return your card, you may bring/mail it to the church offices, or place in the offering plate on Sunday morning.

Even though it is almost December, we still can be snacking on Thanksgiving leftovers or perhaps you sadly think Thanksgiving is over. The minister and humorist, Grady Nutt, coined the word, *"Thanksliving."* He lived life with that kind of gratitude. I searched for the right word – irony – tragedy – absurdity – to note that he died in the prime of his life in a plane crash on the day before Thanksgiving. For Grady, Thanksgiving never belonged to a day or a meal. It became a life of gratitude for every gift and even how he approached death.



This fall provided so many opport unities for "*Thanksliving*" with our GIVE HOPE PROJECT. God blessed us with His vision of transforming our city. We became more of a praying and giving congregation. I hope you understand the privilege God gave us in this project. Even with some of the concerns of such a God-sized dream, one leader shared, "*What could God not like about this*?"

On December 12, our church will celebrate 138 years of sharing the love of Jesus Christ. As a pastor friend told me "God has blessed our church over the years because we have always looked beyond our walls." As we continue the journey of GIVE HOPE, trust the words of the spiritual, "He Never Failed Us Yet."

At our Annual Thanksgiving Dinner, we celebrated our *First Report* of GIVE HOPE with gifts and pledges totaling \$4,417,685. What a tremendous and encouraging start to transforming lives. Raising the financial resources necessary for such a significant project is not a threemonth process. We are so grateful for the initial response and generosity to the *Congregational Phase* for GIVE HOPE. The next phase to begin in January will be visiting with friends and outside donors who would support this vision of transformation. We also know there are others in the congregation who are still praying about their gift to GIVE HOPE. The finish line...we trust that by May 2020 God will provide all we need to reach the \$6 million goal.

Let me say a pastoral word from my heart to those who for whatever reason have remained on the sidelines in making a commitment to GIVE HOPE. I shared in a recent sermon my passion for you to be a part of GIVE HOPE is not some PITCH to get into your wallet. I am at the point in my ministry and life that I don't have time to make PITCHES. Jesus said, *"Night is coming when no one can work."* I only have time for Kingdom work. Plus, over my 48 years of ministry, I have seen too much pain and human hurt to accept the excuses of why someone cannot give to change lives. I am not making a PITCH, but an invitation for you to have the privilege of giving. I don't want you to miss out on this opportunity which can change your life and the lives of so many others.

As your pastor, I would be irresponsible in preparing you for when you come before the Lord one day. We will come to Him in His grace, but according to Scripture, we will stand to give an account. Jesus reminds us in Matthew 25, when we fail to take care of the *"least of these"* we missed out on *"taking care of Him."*.

As we look forward to the joyous season of Advent in preparation of the coming Savior at Christmas, let us remember why Jesus came. Jesus came to give hope. He came to "preach good news to the poor and set free the oppressed." As I prepare for Christmas, I have asked myself, "How does Jesus need to set me free from my chains of self-centeredness?" The first Sunday of Advent is December 1, which is the Sunday of Hope. God left the throne room of heaven to give us the hope that in Jesus "God's Kingdom is near." I pray you will know the "Thanksliving" blessing and Advent Hope of making this world a little more like heaven for our children, our families, and our city.

I watched as N. (name not given) entered the Persian church, He was a quiet, older Iranian man, and he was in "church" for the first time. He had one of those "How did I get myself in this situation?" expressions which translates across cultures. He had accepted the invitation and ride from his neighbor—one of the Iranian Christians who attends regularly. N. joined for our small Bible study. The focus that day was the story of Blind Bartimaeus. I introduced the story to them and we read it together in Persian.


N. did not appear to understand. He did not respond. I sensed I was overwhelming him. The wall between us was massive. I served tea to open things up, and at the end of the study things were a little better, but N. still seemed uncomfortable as he headed into the Persian worship service.

After the service I saw N. again. He was a changed person, smiling from ear to ear. He smiled at me and kept repeating to me in Farsi, "Thank you, thank you." What a transformation. Something had happened in the service and the wall was gone! Blasted away by the Holy Spirit.

This made my day. The Lord Jesus (who asks Bartimaeus in the Bible story. "What do you want me to do for you?") answered that question for N. His need had been met. I could see it by the light shining in his eyes.

We will be taking a group to the Dallas processing center to work an afternoon shift on December 6 if you would be interested in helping with the next phase of the operation. 
