DECEMBER AT FIRST

Traditionally December has been a busy month here at First Baptist Church, and this year is no exception! Between the regular schedule of events and all the additional Christmas events, the calendar is full! To highlight a few of the events, we must start with Advent and the wonderful worship services, each planned to help prepare us for the celebration of the Coming of the Christ Child! December 3 will feature a favorite for many, the parade of flags as we sing Carry the Light. In addition to the flags, this year we will also be dedicating the Hope Center as we near completion and get ready to move in and continue the wonderful work City Light, Counseling, and GLO does in our community. December 10 will feature our Sanctuary Choir and Celebration Orchestra as they present a service of Christmas music. Both the 18 and 24 will continue our journey to Bethlehem during the morning services, with the additional Christmas Eve services on the night of the December 24. The 6:00 p.m. service is more family friendly, while the 11:00 p.m. service will mark the 55th year we have worshiped together and shared in the Lord's Supper as a part of the service.

Musically, FBC is the place to be as we will host: Craig Choir, Abilene Christian High School Choir, Abilene High Orchestra, ACU Vespers, Abilene Christian Elementary Choir, Abilene High School Choir, and Clack Orchestra. Add the Organ Concert on December 15, featuring Bradley Hunter Welch, resident organist for the Dallas Symphony Orchestra, as he will play a program of Advent & Christmas Organ Music.

On December 21, we will have a Longest Night Service in the sanctuary. This service is designed to help those who have experienced the grief and pain associated with the death of a loved one in light of the holiday season. It will be a time of reflection and will end focusing on the hope we have because of the coming of the Christ Child.

December also is a very important month financially for the church. We traditionally have counted on end-of-year gifts to offset the budget deficit and this year is no different. We are currently just over \$320,000 behind in anticipated budget receipts and so finishing strong is really important this year. The finance committee has done a great job in keeping expenses down, but the needs are great and the financial resources needed to allow all of the ministries to function as they planned requires the budget to be met. So, let's finish strong and head into 2024 on a solid financial base.



PEACE, DIRECTION, HOPE - The Light of the World

During this season of Advent (which begins on Sunday, December 3), we will turn our attention to the third part of our focus on becoming fully formed followers of Christ – Hope for the Hungry. There is no better theme to guide us in our time of preparation for Christmas than focusing on the hope we have in Christ and, therefore, the hope we have been entrusted to offer to the world.

We'll kick off this season of Hope with Carry the Light Sunday on December 3. During that service, we will also participate in a special time of dedication for the Hope Center. Immediately follow the worship service and dedication, there will be a time of fellowship and gathering at the Hope Center as we anticipate the opening of this important piece of ministry to and with the community of Abilene. I hope you will make plans to be a part of this important service.

On December 10, we will celebrate Hope through hearing the Christmas selections from our choir and orchestra. I know we will be blessed by this experience.

On the evening of December 21, we will hold a Longest Night service. This service, held on the shortest day and longest night of the year, will hold space for the complicated feelings that many of us experience during the holidays as we deal with loss, grief, and sorrow. During this time together, we will express our sorrows and ultimately turn together to the One Who Offers Hope.

On December 24, we will have our regular service of worship in the morning followed by our annual Christmas Eve services at 6:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m.

I hope to see you at these communal worship experiences. I pray that we will feel the hope of God in this season as we celebrate the Incarnation! I am thrilled to experience our first Advent season together and look forward, in hope, to many to come.

Healing Hearts Ministry officially began their 12th year of ministry in September. We have been fortunate to grow in the last several months. It is so exciting to have some new members! Several of our members entered their creations in the West Texas Fair and won quite a few ribbons for their work. We even have one young lady, age 16, who received "Best in Show" award for her creation. Could this be a new place for you to get involved at FBC?

For those of you who don't know about this ministry, Healing Hearts Ministry is a Prayer Shawl Ministry in which members create and make tangible items such as shawls, throws, "no-sew" fleece blankets, angels, and prayer cloths to give to people who need prayer, as a reminder that prayers are being lifted up for them. We also make hats and scarves for City Light Ministry to keep the "homeless" warm during bad weather. Materials are furnished, or you are welcome to provide your own materials, for the gifts you make.

There are several jobs in this ministry which don't require crocheting or knitting ability. One being the "no-sew" fleece blankets. We would be happy to teach you how to make these blankets. It is possible that one person could cut the strips for the blanket, and a different person could pull the strips through to complete the edging for the blanket. If you enjoy scrapbooking, your skills are needed to document this ministry. We will provide the necessary materials you would need to help in this area. This is something you can do from home, if you prefer. It wouldn't require being present for meetings, unless you wish to attend.

Another way to serve in Healing Hearts Ministry is as a courier who delivers the gifts going to those in need of prayer. These people are very important to our ministry because of the personal encouragement they offer when delivering the gifts.

Our meetings are held on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of each month in Room 6 of University Place from 3:00 to 4:30 p.m. Sometimes, we have a "knit along" on the 2nd Thursday of the month during which time we work on knitting, crocheting, or cutting out "no-sew" fleece blankets. If there is enough interest, we possibly we could extend this to a 4th Thursday, if there is enough interest.

Please consider joining us. If you don't feel led to be a part of our ministry, we would appreciate your prayers for us as we continue to try to encourage those in need of prayer.
