2024 MINISTRY BUDGET PROCESS

Several years ago, we changed the way we did the ministry budget for the church. For many years, the budget committee would present the next year's budget to the church in October and then in November, the church would vote on the new budget for the coming year. The major flaw in that system was that lack of information about how the previous year would end, while still adopting a new budget which could be more than what the previous receipts were. So, the change in timing was made to allow the committee to actually see what came in for the previous year, then make any adjustments to the new budget before taking it to the church. This is very helpful on one hand, but does cause a bit of uncertainty for the month of January as we have not adopted a new budget, but ministry still goes on. Once we vote on the new budget, typically the second week of February, then we have an action plan in place and things settle down.

Last year, the budget committee made a decision to not cut the budget, but rather focus on asking for each of us to seriously consider stepping up and fully understand and practice the Biblical concept of tithing. The committee knew it was a big ask, but felt that cutting back was not what God wanted for us to do. Then in October of 2024, things were

looking pretty bleak as far as budget giving and budget expenses. The alarms were not sounded, but the finger was on the button.

And then we were blessed with two significant stock gifts which all but erased the problem and in fact put us ahead and allowed us to finish the year with the largest budget collection in the history of the church. These gifts, along with the sale of a property, allowed the church to not only meet budget requirements, but to cover deficits in our Mission Action programs and provide the fund balance needed to start the new year. God is Good.

However, the committee also had to acknowledge that this occurred because of one person's giving, not the entire church. So, they asked for some help from the Center for Healthy Churches and were given this advice, for the next 2-3 years, First Baptist Church, Abilene would be wise to try considering:

- Making the 2025 Budget equal to the 2024 expenses
- Develop a 2-3 year plan on how to plan for future inflationary expenses by reducing other budgetary needs

- Develop a 2-3 year plan to reduce the overall personnel budget
- Develop a strategy which prioritizes our local congregational missions over missions beyond the church

So, the 2025 Ministry Budget has been prepared, emailed to the deacons for their review, and discussion by the church is set for Wednesday, February 5 at 5:30 p.m. in the chapel. Final vote on the budget will then take place at the end of the worship service on Sunday, February 9. The budget reflects the suggestions made by the Center for Healthy Churches and is less than last year's budget. It contains increases in utilities. health insurance, and no salary increases. There are decreases in Property and Casualty insurance, 15% reduction in all programming areas, and reductions in all mission dollars outside of FBC.

So, this next year, we will continue to teach the Biblical concept of tithing. We will showcase all of the ministries God has entrusted to us and what those ministries require for them to continue. We will listen to God as to where He wants to take us and how we are to get there.



We are doing great here. Work is very busy. We have acquired a small vineyard from the government for our partnership with Poraka, the group home for adults with developmental delays. We will be using that vineyard to grow grapes for selling to the winery and having grapes for consumption at Poraka. We are still wanting to restart our dairy production and "Cow Bank," and hope that it will restart later this year. The work of the Food Bank is in transition at the moment. We have lost our warehouse and are in the process of constructing a new building. We have received a grant from the Federation of European Food Banks (FEBA) for some of the cost of the construction, but we are still fundraising for the rest. We have a representative from the FEBA coming in February to visit and see our work. We are excited to have a group from FBC coming in June. Alicia's work at the school is going very well. She is the school counselor for over 150 students K-12. Ethan is growing very fast. He is taller than Jeff and still growing. He will finish 10th grade this summer, and he is starting to have an interest in universities. Sorry John, he is looking at A&M. We will be coming back to the USA this summer for partnership development. We are still making our plans so we will let you know if we can make it out to Abilene. We know for sure that Jeff will attend the CBF General Assembly, so if anyone is going to be there we can connect. We love y'all. Thanks for the years of support and prayers for the work here in Macedonia

I go to the refugee camp once a week with a women's group. We do health topics, art sessions, and game days.
