#### **UPDATE FOR THE CONGREGATION**

Patient anticipation. This is our hope for First Baptist as this new year begins: that we will anticipate what lies ahead with patience. As a church in transition, we know things are changing and will change even more. Changes call for patience as we work within shifting circumstances and fresh challenges, but changes also create the opportunity to anticipate new things God wants to accomplish within our congregation.

Following the retirement of Dr. Christopher, we are fortunate to have the leadership of a very capable ministry staff who have taken on extra duties, and we have heard from various gifted preachers over recent months. While that variety has been good this fall, we now look forward to the consistency of a single voice of weekly proclamation as Dr. Matt Cook begins service as our interim pastor on January 9. He will be able to wisely guide us through this new year of transition in which we are patiently listening to discern the leadership of the Spirit of God and preparing for the coming of a new senior pastor one day. Because Dr. Cook is serving as both the consultant to the Pastor Search Committee and as our Interim Pastor, there is a significant financial savings to our congregation by using him in both roles.

In the new year, we are also anticipating two more Congregational Conversations during which the Pastor Search Committee will be listening to what you as a church say about who we are and where we are going. The **Second Congregational Conversation will be on January 23** and will address the FOCUS of our church. The **Third Congregational Conversation will be on February 27** and will consider our church's TRAJECTORY. We will follow the same timeframe for these sessions as for our first conversation. Please put both dates on your calendar: **January 23 and February 27**.

For everyone who came to the first congregational conversation in November, thank you for participating AND we look forward to hearing from you again, because the second conversation will be asking for your feedback on different issues. If you were not able to attend the First Congregational Conversation, we especially want to hear from you in these other two conversations, as it's very important to have your input.

In the Second Congregational Conversation on January 23, we will be looking at two major pieces of information: internal data about the state of our church and external data about the community in which we minister. To say it another way, this second conversation involves a mirror view, whereby we take a look at ourselves, and a window view through which we examine the context around us. The search committee will be presenting data about these two perspectives and asking what you think about this information and what it means for our church now and in the future.

Leading up to our Second Congregational Conversation in January, we are also renewing the call to Prayer@First. We will have prayer emphases in our worship services and on Wednesday evening at 6 p.m., and we ask that all Bible study classes and small groups pray for our church in transition. We encourage you to pray for a good attendance at the Second Conversation and for our church as we grow in our spiritual discernment.

The Pastor Search Committee is grateful for your patience as we continue our work. We have spent many hours analyzing and distilling what you as a church said about our core values during the First Congregational Conversation last November. At our January 23 session, we will report back to the church the results about those core values. The committee is also carefully planning for the Second Congregational Conversation and we hope you will be present to share your insights about where God is leading our church.

#### MISSION BITE #246: CONTINUALLY AMAZED

Caesar makes about \$55 a month. He is a guard who watches over someone else's property and stuff. Six days a week, for about 12 hours a day he sits and guards. His salary supports his wife and two kids. One day recently, he again asked me for a small loan.

In trying to help him become more sustainable we examined his budget. \$30 a month on rent. \$25 a month on food. He started to list other expenses and I stopped him and said you've already reached your total income. He looked down and shrugged.

We talked about him returning to his rural village to try to survive there. He didn't want to go yet.

In early June, COVID-19 began hitting Uganda hard. Everything is again in lockdown. How will Caesar and his family survive on his salary? Now that Uganda is in lockdown they can't return to his village.

I am continually amazed at how people survive on so little. And amazed that when Caesar is off on a Sunday he will be in church.
