NORTH MACEDONIA MISSION TRIP REPORT by John Moore

The best summary for the North Macedonia Mission Trip is...Great Joy! It was great joy to return back to North Macedonia to work with Alicia, Jeff, & Ethan Lee after a long absence. FBC has been involved the Lee's ministry for over 10 years and has played a crucial role in developing the ministry partners who we worked with during that week. Our team was received with great joy at Poraka, a home for adults with disabilities, or a better description for this ministry partner is a small glimpse of heaven. Games were played, shakers made from pill bottles and beans which helped keep the beat to dancing and singing, and kazoos were the new musical instrument introduced to the home and community. Many sounds, new, loud, and different reverberated from the concrete walls and tile floors, but the smiles made up for the loud and sometimes unusual sounds! The North Macedonia Food Bank put our team to work packing food boxes and delivering them to a Roma community just outside of Skopje. The joy of serving here was met with the thankfulness from families receiving the staple food items wrapped around seeing the heartbreaking needs of this community. Our team also witnessed the frustrations from other families who did not receive help that day and spent time in the Roma Center trying to understand this partnership in the context of poverty, discrimination, and distrust. The Roma Center is trying to break down these barriers and bring more joy of connection to this community. And finally, it was a great Joy to be among the dairy cows of Aya Farms. The cow bank strategy (placing a dairy cow in a vulnerable community) continues (FBC had the first cow) and this strategy of community development has expanded to chickens as well. We look forward to egg stories in the future. Our team had the tough job of taste testing the final milk products at the local ice cream store that uses the milk from the farm. Their ice cream tastes better because of the joyful cows and their dairy farmer's great care!

Our team (Jaxon Craig, Beverly Warren, Johnny Warren, Martha Brown, Ken Brown, Todd Wilson and John Moore) represented our joyful church in a mighty way! Together, we ministered, worked, ate (the food is amazing here), listened, and strengthened important partnerships for the Lee's. Our eyes were opened even more to how God is moving in this part of world (especially in the worship service and Lord's Supper we shared at Matka Canyon...it's time to drink the large cup of blueberry juice to remember what Christ did for us!). Our greatest joy came from doing anything we could to support the long-term presence of the Lee's work in North Macedonia. That support and love was shown and lived out in our days there. We will go back next year, maybe now God is calling you to experience this great joy of witnessing how He is moving in our world!!
