Summer budgeting is always a bit heavier than the rest of the year, and traditionally giving is always slightly down over the fall and spring months. It has been often said, people go on vacation, the church does not!

SHAPED BY GRIEF


I hear mumblings of dissatisfaction, someone grumbling about a Food Handler certification "just to flip burgers." He stands there in frustration and questions the certification. This is something we can help with! He seems like a perfect fit for our job training program, albeit rough around the edges and distant. Although a week into classes, if he can self-study and pass the exam, he can come in the program without missing anything. I talk him into it and our relationship begins.

It did not take long to get to know him, as it never takes long with students. That is the nature of the program. I started to see that he wasn't at all the person I saw the day I met him. On the exterior, he seemed unapproachable and off-putting. On the interior, he was quite the opposite. After spending time with him, I began to see how he ended up where he is. I could see how his outer shell had been formed from living in isolation on the streets, as a result of great sorrow. You see, he was really no different than you and I. He loved and had a village. He had a degree, a career, a home, a "normal" life. He lost his village to long and painful illnesses in a short span of time. He watched them wither away until their passing, leaving him alone to deal with his anguish.

Dan was present physically and mentally every day, regardless of what he was going through. He listened to lectures and gave input. He utilized mentoring and tutoring outside of class hours. Culinary questions turned into dynamic conversations about food. Discussions on God's love and faith became a foundation for his future.

He was a remarkable student.

With three weeks left to graduation, classes were canceled due to COVID. It was a devastating blow, as Dan was in the process of starting



a job that he had been waiting for. That restaurant, too, shutting down operations. Dan maneuvered through the pandemic for eight months until it was time to open things back up. He was officially hired on at that point and remains working there to date. He now has a home, a workshop where he builds bikes as his passion, and is surrounded by loved ones. He spreads his love and faith to those around him and helps those in need.

It's impossible to go through something like this with someone and not get close to them. Dan's friendship is something I will cherish forever.

Church-Wide RACER & BAKE SALE

If that is not exciting to you, maybe the aroma of the baked goods which will be in the bake sale will help peak your interest. Whatever it is, I know I am looking forward to Wednesday, July 20, when we will gather at the Family Life Center to enjoy, what we hope is, our First Annual Church-Wide Racer & Bake Sale.

With this being a church-wide event, we will have 3 different divisions of races: children (completed Kindergarten - completed 5th grade), youth, & adult.

We are asking everyone to build a new car from one of the kits we have at church, so this will put everyone on an equal playing (or racing) field! Children's cars will be provided at no cost and we will have three afternoons (Tuesday, July 5; Thursday, July 7; & Monday, July 18) where they can come to church and sand, decorate, and prepare their cars. Each of those afternoons we will be working on the cars from 2-4 p.m. in room 409. Youth and adults will be able to purchase a car kit for \$10. You may come to the church office to choose your car style and pay for your car.

This night will not merely have races going on, as we will also have a bake sale with all homemade items. Money collected will be used to help offset costs for 21 planter boxes built during the McAllen Mission Trip (July 10 – 15). If you would like to bring a homemade item for the bake sale, please bring it to the FLC at 5:30 p.m. on the July 20.

There will be awards for the fastest cars, as well as best decorated, most creative, and most unique cars.
