FOR THE JOURNEY

Last week, I had the privilege of sharing in the service for Cleve Whitener who tragically died in a plane crash on his way to hunt at his ranch. He had so much for which to live and to give. This tragedy reminds us we do not have forever to make our lives count and leave a legacy. Cleve found power in journaling each day in his walk with Christ. I had the holy privilege of reading his journal which was one of the few items recovered from the devastating crash site. He wrote: "Lord forgive my sin. I have not acted nobly. I pray dear Jesus, have mercy on me for I am weak and lowly. How can I be cleansed and made whole? Only by the blood of Jesus."

Cleve's words express the heart of Ash Wednesday and the forty days of Lent as we journey to the cross. "Lord forgive my sin. How can I be cleansed and made whole? Dear Jesus have mercy on me." The forty days of Lent call us to surrender and remember Christ's sacrifice for our sin - only the forgiveness of Christ can make us whole. Lent is not only a time to give something up as we learn to depend on God's grace to satisfy our souls. It is a time to consider what will I give myself to....

Did you ever see or read Thornton Wilder's play, "Our Town"? Emily dies during the birth of her second child. She is given the chance to revisit the happiest day of her life. Emily chooses her twelfth birthday. Yet, from the grave her invisible visit results in major disappointment. Emily becomes troubled that the living can't understand how miraculous it is to be alive and to rejoice in the ordinary things. As she prepares to depart, Emily laments: "Do any human beings ever realize life while they live it - every, every precious minute?"

As we have grieved over Cleve Whitener's tragic death in a plane crash, we don't know how much time we have. Psalm 90 reminds us life is fragile and we are finite. He writes: "Our days may come to seventy years, or eighty, if our strength endures...for they quickly pass and we fly away." "Teach us to number our days, that we might gain a heart of wisdom." Even musicals proclaim the brevity of our days with the lyrics: "Sunrise, sunset,

quickly go the days." When will we become wise enough to see each day is a gift and to rejoice in the ordinary. The Apostle Paul added his call to wisdom: "Do not live as the foolish, but as the wise making the most of every opportunity."

The book of James says, "Now listen, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to this or that city, spend a year there, carry on business and make money.' Why, you do not even know what will happen tomorrow. What is your life? You are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes." James speaks these words of wisdom not to worry us, but to warn us about careless and selfcentered living.

The forty-day Season of Lent calls us to confession in remembering the haunting words of Ash Wednesday, "From dust you came and dust you shall you return." It calls us to remember life is brief - we don't have forever. So, what will we do during these 40 days to "make the most of every opportunity"?

Back on January 9, Cleve penned in his journal: "How do you finish well?" Such a question will not go away. Listen to his answer: "Only by the grace of God. I have strived for a purpose-driven life. I will be a good steward. Fill me with your Spirit that I may walk with you and be a blessing to others. Show me where I am to serve." His testimony captures the essence of the Lenten journey which will lead us to the Spring of Easter - remember,


Baptist University of the Americas...Painting and Fun!

YEAR-END NUMBERS

Once again, the faithfulness of God's people to return to Him a tithe of what He has provided for Kingdom work through the church has been amazing. The gifts to the budget exceeded the 2109 budget by \$27,539. The staff was very conservative in the spending of those funds and actually underspent the budget by \$118,448. So, at the February meeting of the finance committee, they were able to use some of those funds to take care of a project that was outside of the normal budget and one that needed help. The current phone system is 14 years old and many of the components are outdated and difficult, if not impossible to find. Also, with the expansion of the Hope Center, we needed a new phone system which would be able to handle all of those needs and the yearend funds enabled us to do just that. The committee also set aside almost \$60,000 for defer maintenance on the capstone which is a part of almost every building here at the church. The capstone is beginning to show signs of wear and needs repair/replacement in some places and simple sealing in others. These funds will help start that project.
