PRESCHOOL MINISTRY

- Two-year-old Sunday school teacher is needed. All the lessons and crafts are planned for you so it's super easy!

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

- Pray for our volunteers as they encourage and teach the children about Jesus.
- Write a note of encouragement to a child who has recently made a profession of faith.

COLLEGE MINISTRY

- Host a monthly dinner in your homes. It's typically on Sunday evenings from 5:30-7:00 p.m.
- Participate in our Wednesday night intergenerational groups. The intergenerational groups provide opportunities for salt and light as we get to know people on a deeper level and know the needs each person has.
