

VOTE ON FIRST CHRISTIAN FEASIBILITY TEAM PROPOSAL

Following the morning worship service, the church was called back into conference for the purpose of voting on the proposal presented by the feasibility team. By way of reminder, the proposal was:

- First Baptist Church, Abilene would enter into a 3-year capital campaign to purchase the First Christian Church property for \$1,055,000 and to complete renovations to that property to house the City Light Ministry in lieu of remodeling the present City Light facility, to enable expansion of the GLO daycare, and to move a portion of the Ministry of Counseling. This primary project of the campaign has a total estimated cost of \$7,000,000.00.
- After these projects are funded, we would recommend a second campaign to fund the renovation of the vacated GLO facilities on the FBC campus to house our nursery and preschool programs and relocation of adult education facilities into the current nursery and preschool areas adjacent to the Welcome Center at an estimated cost of \$2,500,000.00.

Before the vote, we were all reminded of the generous gift by an anonymous person in our church who has pledged the \$1,000,000 for the purchase of the property. The vote, by written ballot, was counted after the services ended and the results were:

411 FOR the motion and **19 AGAINST** the motion, reflecting **95.58%** in favor. So, now the next step in the process is for First Christian to take the final offer and contract to their members on May 5 for their final approval. Assuming that all goes as we desire, then we would close on the contract sometime over the next 30 days.

As a part of the contract, we have offered use of part of the facilities to First Christian as they work on a transition strategy. Because we will need ample time for the design and develop phase of our projects, this would be of benefit for both parties. Then in the fall of this year, we will present to the church a capital campaign to raise the necessary funds needed for the construction and remolding phases.

Your prayers for the First Christian congregation over the next few weeks would be greatly appreciated. Also, begin now to pray about your involvement in the project. We will need numerous people to help with the campaign and of course volunteers for the exciting new programs we can offer with the expanded facilities.

UDDOCUS FOR THE JOURNEY

I received emails and texts by members who are encouraged and excited about the vote to purchase First Christian Church, the plan for expanding our ministry to the community and even the challenge of the \$7 million Capital Campaign. The vote of almost 96% in favor gives hope about the campaign, which is now \$6 million with the anonymous gift of \$1 million we received. The campaign will certainly be a challenge, but we don't know how God will provide other transformational gifts which will make our goal reachable.

I received another email that was concerned about our giving to the ministry budget. This person's perception was that people are not tithing. He believes if we followed the Biblical teaching of giving 10%, we would never have a shortfall. Everything we have belongs to God. The Bible says in no uncertain words that giving the 10% reminds us what we have comes from God. <u>Tithing is giving our first fruits to God in recognition…it all belongs to Him.</u> We give to God before we see if we are going to have enough or balance the checkbook. This act of faith, of honoring God first, can change our lives. The person who emailed me was concerned people are missing out on the blessing of putting God first in their giving and living. Tithing is not a law, but a blessed way of life that leads to financial freedom.

It is interesting the way we use the Bible to support certain behaviors to live a moral life, but exclude the Bible's teaching on giving. We want our children to be honest, but then we cheat God when it comes to our giving. What are they learning? We might have everything we want, but we miss out on what we desperately need – a blessed life of generous giving – the best lesson we can teach our children.

If you look closely, the book of Malachi mentions more than the tithe. He talks about the tithe <u>and</u> the offering. It is tithes <u>and</u> offerings that bring the blessing of giving. <u>Above the tithe, are the offerings which will support our</u> <u>Capital Campaign</u>. There are two Biblical principles: 1) We give to the Lord first each month to know the blessing of our finances. 2) We give over and above the tithe, our offerings, because only that abundance which is shared can be multiplied. We tithe to the church as it is commanded, *God's Storehouse*, to return the 10% that already belongs to God. We give offerings above and beyond so our gifts and finances can be multiplied like the loaves and fishes of the young boy.

Mary and I have seen the ways these two principles of blessing work - the tithe <u>and</u> offering. They do not mean we received some windfall. We have found when we give both tithes <u>and</u> offerings, God has provided abundantly more than we can imagine. We have given out of our savings only to find the abundance and multiplication of how God provides. I hope more than expecting some return as you tithe to the budget, and in considering the offering of multiplication to the Capital Campaign, you will know the blessed life which comes in giving.

The power of giving - it comes from the heart - not a paycheck,

A special thank you to all of the people who gave up their time of worship on Easter Sunday to be with our preschool kids during extended session. I'm always amazed at how you come through in times of need and I know I never have to worry about having enough volunteers...and that's because of YOU! I had church members coming in out of nowhere asking if I needed help and when you have 18 two-year-olds in one class you say "YES"! We had close to 75 kids in extended session and we are very thankful for the time we were able to spend with these sweet kids on a beautiful Easter morning. I'm beyond thankful for all of you who give of your time to serve in extended session. You truly make a difference in the lives of these little ones and their families...but especially in mine.

God is so good and we are blessed to serve a risen Savior who loves us and shows us abundant grace.
