BLESSED FAMILY

Blessed Family may be one of the least known ministries of First Baptist Church, but it is SPECIAL!

Twice a year, the FBC Family Life Center closes to the general public for an evening dedicated to children with special needs and their families. Starting with a handful of families in 2018, the ministry survived COVID and now draws about 150 individuals with autism and other disabilities in October and April.

The brainchild of retired public school counselor Trina Fink, Blessed Family is designed to help families with special needs children by offering many different kinds of experiences — from petting a therapy dog to working with modeling clay and watercolors Other activities include: adapted bowling and roller skating, volleyball using a tennis net and a beach ball, navigating a colorful obstacle course on the gym floor, ping pong, and lots of table games. There's even a Calming Room with mood lighting and soft music if a child is overwhelmed by all the fun.

And there's a pizza dinner for all when the kids are "played out."

More than a dozen FBC members volunteered to ensure that each activity was staffed. Bob Fink and Joel Tucker, volunteers since the first Blessed Family event, agreed that seeing the joy in the children and their families is worth all the effort.

Linda Chisholm, leader of our church's Paws for People program, brought her nine-year-old miniature poodle, "Hope" to be the therapy dog. It marked Hope's first outing since she lost her eyesight recently. I thought I might photograph her with a visually impaired child. But before that, God provided a better picture: when guardians checked in Tumaninjuguna, a nine-year-old native of Kenya in a custom wheelchair, we learned that her name in Swahili means "Hope."

Linda and I were both choking back tears when the Kenyan Hope gently petted the head of the canine Hope, who made a joyful sound and smiled broadly. Canine Hope's wagging tail signaled a connection that the Creator of All Things Great and Small provides.



Four different offerings combined into One Unified Missions Offering

1. Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Global Missions - 60%

Supports the long-term presence of CBF field personnel serving in the United States and around the world. It helps to promote and provide: salaries, insurance and children's education for nearly 60 field personnel serving on the mission field; leadership, ministry, and development of the local church among the least evangelized; Bible translations and digital resources to reach international refugees, immigrants, and students; justice/reconciliation for the most marginalized and works to end extreme poverty through development; and transforming communities to restore natural environments.

2. Texas Baptist World Hunger - 15%

The Texas Baptist Hunger Offering unites the body of Christ to end hunger and poverty and promote holistic transformation in the name of Jesus through over 100 hunger relief and development ministries across Texas and around the world. It also supports projects across the world that feed the hungry and help the hungry help themselves in the context of holistic Christian ministry.

3. Abilene Community Transformation - 15%

Provides resources for responding to specific ministry opportunities and needs right here in Abilene. These resources help to transform families, neighborhoods, and ministry partners within the Big Country.

4. Baptist World Aid - 10%

Since 1920, Baptist World Aid has networked Baptists around the world to alleviate poverty and hunger, respond when disasters strike, and support sustainable community development projects around the globe. This is the compassionate arm of the Baptist World Alliance and provides help for persons in need globally through disaster relief, alleviation of hunger, medical assistance to those affected by HIV/AIDS, and community development.

The Ministry of Counseling and Enrichment has so much to be thankful for! This season, my heart is full of gratitude for the many ways God is blessing our ministry.

While the board has described these as small tokens of gratitude, they meant the world to us. In the quiet and sometimes difficult spaces of the therapy room, these gestures remind us that we are seen, valued, and loved.

A special word of thanks goes to Gayla Cook, LPC Associate, who represented MOCE at an information fair at Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center. Through her efforts, MOCE is now contracted to see both TTUHSC students and employees. This is an exciting new opportunity to extend our care.

COUNSELOR SPOTLIGHT: Dr. Michael McNeil

This month, the Ministry of Counseling and Enrichment (MOCE) is honored to highlight Dr. McNeil, a psychologist who has faithfully served with the ministry since 2011. Dr. McNeil's path to counseling began in 1974, when he volunteered as a peer counselor for a community agency. That experience sparked a lifelong calling leading him to study psychology at California State University East Bay and later earn his Ph.D. in Psychology from the University of Texas at Austin. Along the way, he balanced graduate studies, family life, and a range of roles including juvenile probation officer and private practice therapist.

Dr. McNeil feels particularly passionate about helping clients with narcissistic personality disorder and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). He describes his work as "something perpetually useful. I find it a blessing to keep helping others for as long as I can." He also hopes more people understand that seeking therapy is not a sign of weakness.

For Dr. McNeil, MOCE has always been "a welcoming place with genuine care and no games." Outside of his counseling work, he enjoys writing science fiction and fantasy and has completed three novels. He humorously describes himself as "a writer, but not yet an author." He is married, has three grown children, and two grandchildren.

Dr. McNeil's message to our community is both simple and powerful: "You don't have to be lonely. Often, loneliness is at the heart of what brings people to therapy. A therapist can help you understand that and find ways to overcome it."

We are grateful for Dr. McNeil's wisdom, humor, and steadfast service through the Ministry of Counseling and Enrichment.
