UNLOCKING THE BLESSINGS OF GENEROUS LIVING...

Let me tell you two stories. Last fall, we gave every member of the congregation the book, *The Blessed Life* to explore the power of generosity. We even labeled the book with your name so that you would pick up your copy and hopefully read it and apply it.

Story one. One person picked up the book and returned it in the mail with a card that said, "No thanks." I am not sure of the person's objection. I had said that I did not agree with everything in the book, but I believed it would open up possibilities of generosity, realizing the first fruits or 10% of our income belongs to God, which goes to the church, God's storehouse. (Malachi 3:8-10) I was stunned someone would go to such an extent to return the book. When I opened up the package and saw the book and note I was sad. I wondered what made him or her so angry.

Story two. This person owns a small business. At times he has struggled to get by. He doesn't make a salary, but works off commission. He shared the difference the book has made in his life about trusting God, especially in his finances. He even bought the audio tape of the book to listen as he drives to work. He has not received some financial windfall for his giving, but God has abundantly provided for him in so many ways – I wish I could tell the ways he has been blessed.

Jesus said, "Give and it will be given to you...." I realize some of you are shaking your heads. Phil, are you proposing a gospel of prosperity? We give to get, right? I realize there are well-meaning preachers who teach about this kind of selfish motivation. Give to God and you will get more – what a deal.

We do not give for a "get-rich" scheme. How do you think God feels when people get excited about giving to God's Kingdom purpose as they think about what they can get out of it? As Robert Morris says, "Do you think God ever says, 'Boy if only my people would start giving so they can get more stuff or buy a summer home."

God doesn't want us to catch a vision of getting. He wants us to catch a vision of giving. This goes way beyond our money. Jesus says in Luke 6:37-38, "If we give forgiveness, we receive forgiveness. If we do not condemn, we will not be condemned." If you give forgiveness, an abundance of forgiveness will be given back to you. As you give and sow love, you will receive an overflowing harvest of love. We call this the principle of reciprocity and a fundamental principle of the Kingdom of God. As the Bible says, "We will reap what we sow."

Last fall, we gave you *The Blessed Life*. We hoped to help people have a heart transplant. We seek to raise up a new generation of generous givers who will discover the blessed life. It is true that when we give, God gives back. However, that is not our motivation for giving. Giving is the way to imitate our wonderful Father. I hope during October you will revisit the principles of *The Blessed Life*. If you do not have a copy of the book, it will be available in the Welcome Center. October will be the season for us to discover The Blessed Life, even as we see the change of the seasons...

GENEROUS LIVING by Mike Greenfield

Last year, the church provided each family a copy of the book, *The Blessed Life*. The basic premise of the book is that the first 10%, or first fruits, belongs to God. We, as a church, believe the Bible to be the word of God and the Bible is very clear about what our relationship to our financial resources should be. We are to tithe (one tenth of our resources) to God through the local church. According to the Bible, that is the starting point. The Bible also talks about offerings which are also given to specific causes at specific times for specific reasons. Those are separate and above the tithe. Then there is support given to other worthy causes that God brings into our paths. These are worthwhile and many of them are Christ-centered and do great Kingdom work. So, as you think about your tithe, offerings, and support, here are some thoughts that might help.

Your tithe goes to support the ministry budget of the church. When talking about the ministry budget, sometimes those numbers can be a bit overwhelming. Just the mention of \$3,289,732 is almost too much to handle. However, that is the number needed to do all that we feel God is calling us to do in 2017! So, I decided to try and make it a little bit easier to picture just what that figure represents. So, imagine for just a moment that you have in your hand a crisp new \$100 bill. It has the new design with all of the colors and that great picture of Ben Franklin. Now, if you were to give that \$100 bill to the church, here is how it would be divided up.

\$5 of it would immediately go to Global Missions as we help with work around the world. \$3.15 would be used for all of the programming at City Light. \$2.15 enables us to broadcast our Sunday worship services on TV. \$4.84 helps GLO, \$2.86 to Counseling, and \$4.90 for the FLC. All of those figures are a part of the budget section called Missions and Evangelism and along with many more items; they would be \$30.01 of the \$100.

\$3.89 would keep the lights burning and A/C running by paying the electric bill. \$0.59 for water, \$0.25 for gas, and \$3.19 for insurance on the buildings in case we have another hail storm! Altogether, the maintenance area would receive \$16.40 of the \$100 to take care of the church property and the folks who do that on a daily basis.

It may not seem like much, but in an effort to provide education about missions for our children as well as adults, \$0.25 would help with that area. Only 2 pennies are needed for the GA literature, but those 2 pennies are really important.

To provide for all the work that falls under Dr. Christopher, \$5.53 are used to cover that area. \$3.33 for Media and Communications, \$3.17 for the Preschool ministry, of which \$0.63 enables all the programming to be covered in that area. \$0.22 covers First Friends Preschool, \$2.65 is set aside for the Children's Ministry, \$3.82 for Youth, and \$2.09 for Emerging Adults. On the adult side of things, \$3.31 covers the working age adults, \$1.50 for the seniors. Music, which includes the children's choirs, would receive \$6.91, and \$0.56 is needed to take care of all the food service items. Discipleship and Leadership Training need \$0.57, the finance office uses \$2.71 and the administration area would get \$6.55. To cover all of the personnel benefits, \$10.41 is needed of the \$100.

So, when you look at that \$100 bill and think that only \$0.29 is what was needed to take care of Vacation Bible School for 2017, or that \$0.17 would cover DiscipleNow, it is quite clear that every penny, dollar and yes, \$100 bills, really do matter.

We are in excellent shape in regards to the budget giving right now. If we continue the trend, then we should finish the year making budget! That is the result of your faithfulness and truly living a Blessed Life.

GIVING SO OTHERS CAN GO



Due to security reasons, we are limited in some of the information that we can share, but we are not limited in how we can support and pray them. What does the support of the FBC family for the Offering for Global Missions accomplish? For hundreds of field personnel through the years, it has meant that we have had endless opportunities to bear witness to the love and grace of Jesus Christ, to seek transformational development, and to cultivate beloved community. That work has occurred on six continents in more cities, towns, villages, and hamlets than any of us could name. Through you, lives have been changed – eternally.

To put a couple of names to these efforts, we (Hunter & Mary) would like to introduce you to John and Bell (aliases). John and Bell grew up in a Bramong (our people group) village, but came into relationship with Christ as young adults. They now spend their time reaching out to their friends and family - not always a safe activity. Historically, the local church has had little to do with the Bramong as they are a minority group in the country and are often misunderstood. With an intimate knowledge of the Bramong and a love and understanding of the local church, they are making strides in bringing the two together. They are also providing a safe house for young Bramong girls who are at risk of being trafficked. John is pastoring one of the first churches composed of Bramong believers. It is our honor to be able to walk with them to provide guidance, encouragement, and support.

For a good portion of our 20 years on the field, FBC Abilene has included us among its family. We give thanks on every remembrance of you. Because of you, we have been able to fulfill God's call by providing support to the efforts of those working to stop human trafficking, secure land and human rights for the poor, and secure health care and educational opportunities for migrant workers and their children. We have also assisted in development projects: cattle and chicken farming, selling honey, and providing preschool education for children in the largest slum area in the country. Your generous support to the Offering for Global Missions makes a difference in the lives of thousands of people around the world. Please pray and see if God would have you join this work by giving to the Offering for Global Missions.
