We cannot take this journey alone.

I am excited to journey down this road together. These building blocks provide us a scaffold to continue digging deeper into our faith, to work it out with fear and trembling. I am excited to see how we grow together, trusting the sustainer of our faith to work towards its completion.

We'll begin this journey together in earnest on October 1 as we explore the different aspects of peace that God wants to offer us. Can't wait to see you there.





The Mission's Committee is so very pleased to welcome our newest missionary, Jana Lee. Jana is serving in Larnaca, Cyprus partnering with All4Aid. Cyprus is currently the largest per capita population of asylum seekers, with the number of refugees increasing significantly over the past five years. All4Aid is working with the refugees and asylees by way of Non-Food items (NFI) Distribution Programs, Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) Programs, Food Security Programs, and Education/Workshop Programs. Jana will be working to develop health education programs to improve health outcomes of the refugees staying in camps.

## MY SUMMER IN THAILAND Brookley Baker

This past summer, Brookley Baker, one of our very active college students had the opportunity to travel and minister in Thailand. We are so thankful for how God uses our college students to change the world.

This summer, I saw an array of life in Thailand and participated in various forms of missions in Thailand through ACU's World Wide Witness program. For my first three weeks, I was in Chiang Mai, a large city in northern Thailand surrounded by mountains. I built relationships with members of the church where I stayed and helped lead two summer camp experiences for Karen refugee university students. The students learned Biblical concepts like the Trinity, how giving is better than receiving, prayer, memorizing Scripture, and the power of a Father's love. At the end of the week, students wrote a reflection explaining their favorite lesson and how it related to their life. The goal of these Friendship weeks was for every student to move closer to God, whatever their relationship with God looked like at the beginning of the week.

For my second three weeks, I was in a small town called Kranuan in northeast Thailand. I lived with a family who lead a church and I taught English at the local public school to invite students to church events. The students were overjoyed to have Americans at their school, and some students would come to the church after school to play games or teach each other songs. My time at the public school helped bridge the school, including the Buddhist principal, with the Christian church. While I could provide English lessons and a smiling face, the love and hospitality I received from the Kranuan community gave me a deeper understanding of loving strangers and welcoming foreigners. A few of my favorite memories include having a mud fight with the Kranuan children after working in the rice fields, teaching Karen refugee students how to make apple pie, and the many tearful and heartfelt goodbyes I shared.

Throughout my trip, I enjoyed learning about cultural differences and how they impact

a Thai's Christian faith. One example is that Thais quote Matthew 6:11, "Give us this day, our daily rice," as they eat rice, not bread, with every meal, including breakfast (it was weird at first, but I adapted quickly). It was beautiful to see people connect with God across national and cultural boundaries and gain a deeper understanding of love and hospitality through their actions. I am ever grateful for the support of FBC and its members who made this experience possible. Thank you for being a church who supports God's work through people like me and shows Christ's love and hospitality in Abilene and beyond.
