#### **CITY LIGHT "CARES" FOR PEOPLE**

June saw my temporary hiring at City Light Community Ministries as a grant clerk. The ministry received \$196,000 through the CARES Act and needed to distribute it by September. We knew we were able to disperse the funds, but they were claimed faster than we expected. We opened and closed the program in twelve days with more than one hundred applications. As appointments began in July, we maintained a pace of a dozen meetings per week until mid-August, all the while signing paperwork, calling landlords, and calculating just how much money we had left. By the end of August, 72 households met with us and secured their rent. While the numbers are incredible, the stories were powerful, too.

Each appointment involved people with unique and challenging lives. Some shared about raising other people's children, employment difficulties, or troubling medical situations. Some meetings became even more serious as they confided in us their grief, difficulty accessing food, or experiences with domestic violence. These were the sessions I was never sure what to do with, but my incredible boss, Stephanie Stewart, is a rock. At the end of each meeting, I watched her extend her business card to everyone, and I realized she offered much more than a phone number. She offered dignity and hope.

Our appointment room housed a used copy machine, three chairs, and a desk, but don't be fooled by its humility! Stephanie transformed it during every appointment by giving each applicant compassion and attention. She was rather discreet with her agenda of kindness, though, as she began each meeting with the same question: "What brings you in today?" Some people responded with their life story, while others gave a simple "rent help." No matter their answer, she listened. After the first week of meetings, I learned that this—the

listening—was the best way to serve our neighbors. Not only did we meet their basic need for shelter, but we helped meet deeper emotional needs. When Stephanie asked and listened, each person was dignified in a world which tramples on the unwealthy and ignores the needs of the suffering. In her compassion towards every neighbor, my boss taught me how City Light functions. Yes, they feed people and offer a reprieve from the weather, but they also recognize the humanity in all our neighbors. City Light gets to remind them they are made in God's likeness. In this, the work City Light does is the same work Christ did 2,000 years ago and asks us to continue.

After helping spread the grant to our physical neighbors, I expect this experience will encourage us to live generously. Many of the applicants already do, sharing their homes and food with their neighbors, and I am glad we could support their efforts. But the purpose of this grant was not to reward generous people, as it didn't matter who they were when they applied. Nothing in the application measured their goodness or generosity, nor should it have. The purpose of this grant was to give money to struggling people. If Christ has taught us something, there is no earning grace, and the CARES grant is a small example of this holy principle. For the applicants, there was no earning their portion of the \$196,000 other than applying and qualifying. There were families with five children and households of one. Working, unemployed, and retired adults. Families mourning recent deaths, pregnant people, and people across every spectrum of identity, be it race, age, ability, gender, or anything else. These people received help because they are human. We receive Jesus' sacrifice because we are made in God's image. It is the same principle applied 2,000 years apart and I am honored to be part of a process that shows my neighbors the grace of God.
