## PRAYERWORKS MINISTRY

Have you ever wondered what happens to the prayer requests after they are dropped into one of the wooden prayer request boxes at our church, FLC, City Light, Ministry of Counseling, Hope Center, or GLO? Also, what happens to those put into the offering plate during church service? The cards are taken from the plates and boxes, which are checked once a week, to the prayer room across from the library. There, they are prayed over for at least a month, some much longer, depending on the request and need. If requested by the sender, a prayergram postcard of hope and encouragement with scripture may be sent to the person in need.

## STEWARDSHIP EDUCATION by Mike Greenfield

Talking about giving is a very natural part of our spiritual walk, or maybe it should be. We, as a church, believe the Bible to be the word of God and the Bible is very clear about what our relationship to our financial resources should be. We are to tithe (one tenth of our resources) to God through the local church. According to the Bible, that is the starting point. The Bible also talks about offerings which are also given to specific causes at specific times for specific reasons. Those are separate and above the tithe. Then there is support given to other worthy causes God brings into our paths. These are worthwhile and many of them are Christcentered and do great Kingdom work. So, as you think about your tithe, offerings, and support, here are some thoughts that might help.

## **Giving Options to Consider**

In the fast paced, high technological world we live in, writing a check and putting it in an envelope seems totally foreign to many of us now. But here at the church, we have used the same tried and true system of offering envelopes for folks to have an easy way to give their tithes and offerings for the support of the ministry budget. So as technology changes, so should the church change to keep up with what people are doing in other areas of their lives.

Online giving is not entirely new to what we have been offering as a way to give. On the church website, www.fbcabilene.org, there is a link on the top row of options that takes you to the giving page for the church. The link is in a green box and says "Give Online." Simply click on this link and it will

walk you through the process. Of course, by using this method it requires a credit or debit card, both of which have a 2.2% fee associated with it and are hoping that folks will include that in their thinking as they use this method.

Another option is to set up a bank draft that would take a set amount out of your account and put in the church account on a set time frame. This option does not have any associated fees and takes out the "remember to do it" factor. Jeannie Jowers in the finance office can help you set this up or answer questions you might have. This is really convenient when you are travelling or want to simplify your life.

## Gifts That Keep On Giving

Regular gifts of tithes and offerings to the church are the most important forms of giving. These gifts make it possible for the church to continue to carry out the ministries of Jesus Christ at home and around the world.

However, you may have a desire to do something special and make a gift which bears fruit year after year. If so, the First Baptist Church Foundation can help you accomplish that desire. As a result of the interest expressed by some church members to make possible long-term, deferred, or special gifts for the future ministries of the church, the Foundation was established by the church in 1993. The foundation board distributes grants from the earnings twice a year for requests which meet the purpose of the foundation.

Those folks tend to fall into two categories, employees of the church and lay people who serve on the various boards, committees, ministry teams, and as deacons. I am privileged to serve

alongside of some of the best people in the world. Every pastor, director, ministry assistant, custodian, teacher, whether full-time or part-time does their job with excellence and grace. They are a joy to be around and make the work environment an enjoyable place to be. The tenure of many of our employees gives testimony to the type of work environment we have. On September 5, Lee Curiel is marking his 45th year of employment here at FBC. Jeanne Jowers has passed the 30-year mark, and we have 11 others who are over the 20-year mark. So, either they have no where else to go (don't think that is the reason!) or they have found a place to work which feels like home! So, to all of the employees of FBC, I salute you and say a very heart-felt thanks.



The other group of folks who I have really come to appreciate this past year are all the members of the various committees and ministry teams which I have the privilege of serving with. Round Up would not happen if there weren't a group of guys willing to cook 332 lbs. of beef and another group cook 100 lbs. of

chicken! Add the other volunteers who prepare all the other fixin's and make the meal happen, and I simply get much of the credit for their hard work. On the committee side of things, a few of those really had their workload increase because circumstances within the church. The personnel committee, under chair Jane Todd, has been such a support and given wonderful guidance as we have navigated these "difficult days." The finance committee has kept the church in a solid fiscal position in spite of some decrease in giving. They have ensured that all the bills have been paid and ministries are able to continue, though on a scaled back basis due to the shortfall in funds.

So, as we start a new church year and prepare for our next Senior Pastor, my prayer would be that we all take hold of the rope which moves our church and make sure we are all pulling together and in the same direction. We need to pull together financially as we all commit to tithing and supporting the church as instructed in God's word. We need to pull together in our prayers for the church, the staff, the search committee, and for each other. We need to pull together in our attendance and participation in the life and ministry of the church. We simply need to pull together!
