Grace Based Parenting, by Dr. Tim and Darcy Kimmel, is a video series in three parts. Each part has eight weekly sessions. We were able to offer Part 1 last Spring. Those parents will be able to move on to Part 2 this fall. We will offer Part 1 to parents who would like to begin looking at parenting through a grace lens.

We are pleased that FBC will co-host Fresh Grounded Faith Conference, a women's event this coming October, with Jennifer Rothschild as the main speaker. As part of this great opportunity, we will offer a video based Bible study for women. This study, written by Jennifer Rothschild, will be offered on Wednesday evenings and Thursday mornings. FOR THE JOURNEY

I know it is only the first of August and you still have some vacation time planned this month. We will be in Victoria this week – not exactly the paradise destination in travel brochures, but scenic Victoria is where our granddaughter lives. Need I say more? Even if you are still in summer mode, the start of school is just around the corner. Our August issue features stories on the new beginnings that come this time of year.

I want to approach the subject of new opportunities by pointing to "winter." Say what? I realize in the "dog days" of August, winter seems like a long way off. I am not speaking so much about the "season" as about the brevity of life and how opportunities can slip away. As Teve sings in Fiddler on the Roof: "Sunrise, sunset...quickly go the days." The prophet Jeremiah announces the urgency of our decisions: "The harvest has past, the summer has ended but nothing has changed for us. We are still waiting for God's healing."

The Apostle Paul understood the urgency of our living with the approaching winter as he pleaded with Timothy, "Come quickly, do it now, winter is coming." Time was of the essence. He wrote from a Roman jail knowing his days were numbered. The Apostle called out to his dear friend, Timothy, "Do your best to come to me before it is too late... winter is coming."

Come quickly, do it now, winter is coming...

Paul needed a pastoral visit before he faced the executioner. He feared that spring would be too late. Paul understood that the high seas of the Mediterranean and the continual cloud cover would make navigation next to impossible during the winter. So he urged his brother to come quickly before the opportunity is lost forever. Paul's plea about "Coming quickly" became the title of one of the most famous sermons ever preached. It was preached thirty-seven times in First Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania by Clarence Edward McCartney. The congregation was so moved by this "call to urgency" the church asked the sermon be preached every year. All of us need this kind of message as we approach new beginnings. What will we do with them?

There are simply things in life that cannot be neglected or put off. Opportunities perish with procrastination; doors can shut. These observations are not intended to create panic or fear, but invite us to live with an urgency in making the most of our opportunities – "Come quickly, do it now, winter is coming."

Perhaps the word that undermines our sense of urgency more than anything else is manana – tomorrow. What if Timothy had waited till "tomorrow?" It is so easy in our busyness to keep saying, "I'll get to that later," but later never comes and winter arrives. Perhaps it is time for you to mend a grudge, say "thank you," share a compliment, or say, "I love you; please forgive me" – winter is coming.

Please do not hear this as a guilt trip. I hope this will be a grace moment as we journey into a "new school year" filled with all kinds of possibilities. The poet, Tennyson, said, "It is not too late to seek a new world." As we approach this time of new beginnings: What is God calling you to do right now in your life? What have you been putting off? As we move to a time of new beginnings, whatever you need to do, do it today. Trust, as you act, God will bless your decision more than you can imagine.






PEAKS & VALLEYS by Claire Preston
