CITY LIGHT UPDATES

City Light not only prepares hot lunches three days a week and breakfast on Sunday morning, they also offer a sack lunch on Wednesdays to be eaten with their soup or take home after their meal. We need volunteers help put together these sack lunches on Tuesday mornings beginning at 8:30 a.m. Each of the 450 sacks include a can of Vienna Sausage, bag of chips, bag of cookies, favorite scripture passage, spoon, and napkin. Also, please pray for this important ministry as it really does make a difference in our community.

CARES ACT FUNDING:

In July, the United Way of Abilene awarded \$196,000 of CARES Act funding to City Light Community Ministries. The CARES (Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security) Act was distributed from the federal government to the city of Abilene to provide necessary financial relief for our residents. In TWO WEEKS, all \$196,000 was allocated to our neighbors in Abilene. Neighbors completed an extensive application process to demonstrate their need for this financial assistance. The funding enabled us to help families with up to six months of both back and future rent payments. A HUGE THANKS to Alicia Nickelson, Beth Young, Makenzie Morrison, Ron Rainwater, and Susie Vandever for helping Stephanie Stewart process applications, schedule appointments, allocate funding, and help our neighbors navigate the entire process. We have been doing 12 appointments a week, and will finish distributing the funds on August 11. Next month we will share more about how this money will change our neighbors' lives!



FAMILY LIFE CENTER

The Family Life Center opened in 1981. Our mission is to provide family-oriented activities for the church membership & surrounding communities in a Christian atmosphere at an affordable price. Our facility accommodates a variety of groups such as businesses, churches, day care/day camps, private home schools, public schools, individuals with special needs, universities, military, family reunions, residential treatment centers, exercise groups, and Fellowship of Christian Athletes to list a few. We host birthday parties, bridal showers, wedding receptions, and Family Fun Nights. In addition, we have a full fitness center with lockers, showers, and sauna amenities. For those who simply want a place to walk, out of the weather, our track or gym is free to the public.

MCALLEN MISSION TRIP REPORT

Penitas, Texas is the place to be on the second week of July every year for our Family Mission Trip! This year, we were two degrees cooler than Abilene with a steady and highly humid breeze out of the south. Thankfully, we had a great canopy on location providing shade and we added the new missions canopy tent (thanks Candy and Becky) to complete the shaded cooling station on site of the new Buckner Home for the Martinez family (102 degrees out in the sun and 96 degrees under the shade). This family of six has been working hard to make this new home a reality and our team of 12 FBC'ers plus Brisa, a new friend of FBC and 14-year-old Martinez daughter, worked hard during that week to help them move their new home closer to completion. Our group, led by our Flooring Supervisor (Jill Hudson) and Paint Supervisor (Tim Griffin), painted and floored the entire house during this week. A beautiful pale seafoam teal with bright white trim were the exterior paint colors and the laminate flooring was of the golden amber oak variety. On the last day, our shelving team, led by our Shelving Supervisor (Becky Tucker), completed the kitchen pantry shelving. Your team from FBC, and Brisa, worked really hard to make all this happen and, in the process, helped change the future for this family through nice, affordable housing. However, the greatest change happened in our team. We saw and bore witness to the fact that God is moving in this unincorporated area of Texas and in the families and ministry of Buckner International. Witnessing this God movement in this community changed our hearts and serving together brought us in deeper fellowship with each other. We learned new painting techniques and flooring skills which will prepare us for future ministry projects.

We added to our project a tour of the

in downtown McAllen. Our eyes were opened and hearts broken to hear stories of families desperate to make life better for their families here in our country. This demonstration of love and hospitality to the "stranger" made an impact on our team and will shape future ministry projects for our Family Mission Trips in this area. We were thankful to learn of the great relationship with Buckner and Catholic Charities and the strong desire to cooperatively work together to minister to families. Our challenge question towards the end of the week, which is the same for any ministry project away from home, was this: How do we bring this joy of serving, and what God is teaching us, back home? Taking advantage of current ministry opportunities, realizing we have much to be thankful for and to give, opening our eyes to see new ministry opportunities, and clearing our busy schedules were all discussed to answer our challenge questions. That question goes to you now...How are you serving and leading your family to serve in our community, state, and world through our church? Maybe even now, God is calling you to find new and existing ways to serve at or with our church. Maybe God's calling you to serve in the heat of Penitas, Texas next July. Will you join us next year? We will have our new missions canopy up, lots of cool shade for you, and we'll try our best to arrange for cooler conditions! We had a great Family Mission trip for 2023 and we're thankful to be at a church who is willing to pray for us while we're gone, continue our local ministries in our absence (shout out to our City Light staff and church staff), and invest in a family trying to make a better future for those they love.

So, we encourage you to become a part of a group! If you aren't sure, find someone who did participate and ask them about it. Or, just show up and try it out. I'm certain we'll see you again.

We also had several of our college age women who had many deep insights into God's Word, poured out such wisdom, and could boldly express their faith. Although I had to miss some meetings, I still felt connected to the ladies and loved running into them on Sundays. What a great way for us to connect with people we might not have otherwise.

What could be better than studying God's Word - in a way that it applies to our daily lives - with three generations of women all in one circle? This is what we did on Wednesday nights in the spring. In my circle, some of the women were trusted long-time friends; while others were ones I did not know well, and others were completely new to me. Now, they are all friends!!

Studying the "women in the genealogy of Jesus" through a set of questions, led to deep insight, valuable wisdom from the others, and concrete ways to put scripture to work every day. Isn't that our goal?

Discussing the same scripture for two weeks was helpful. It gave the opportunity to ponder longer and to think on what others in the group had shared. If you had to miss a week, it was easy to catch up. No pressure!

We hope you will consider being a part of the Worship and Music Ministry this fall and participate with us as we lead in worship each week.




