We had 8 families at our First Steps Lunch, including 6 families in their 20s. We have had baptisms and meaningful worship services. God seems to be moving, and we are discerning the best way to follow! Keep praying, keep showing up, keep worshipping, and keep serving. Let's see what God can and will do through His Grace.

If you see a sign around the office that says "We can Spell – CPELL" do not worry about our spelling abilities! Although, I'm not sure any of us are going to do well during a spelling bee! Our staff, during staff retreat, came up with a set of values for our pastoral staff to rally around. These are Centered, Presence, Excellence, Loyalty, and Love (CPELL). We want to be centered around Jesus. This is not only about our messages, but with our lives. When we flow from the center, we flow from Grace. The next value we chose is Presence. The present is a gift. We want to be present right where we are. If we are in a committee meeting, let's be present. If we are in a hospital or in a worship service, let's be present and aware of God's movement and the person or people in front of us. After presence is Excellence. The only thing we can really give God is ourselves. Are we giving God our best selves? Are we giving and offering God excellence in our worship, our programming, our discipleship, and our serving? After excellence is Loyalty. One of the ways to translate the word "faith" in Greek is loyalty or allegiance. Our loyalty will be to Jesus and each other. This means being trustworthy and accountable. Finally, our last, but certainly not least, value is love. God is love after all. So are the things we are doing with love. It's great to be excellent, except if it does not have love, it comes across as cold and hollow. We can be the most gifted person in the world, but if we do not have love, we have missed the mark.

These values for our pastoral staff will be used to remind us what we are working for, gives us guidelines in our being and doing, and to evaluate ourselves as we do the

work of ministry with you. We believe God will shine through our efforts in living out these values. Grateful to be here.

COUNSELOR SPOTLIGHT: Mike Kesler

For the past 18 years, the Ministry of Counseling and Enrichment (MOCE) has been blessed to have Mike Kesler serving as part of our counseling team. Mike brings a wealth of experience and a heart for walking with people through life's challenges.

Mike's professional path began in East Texas, where he earned both his Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Texas A&M Commerce. While working on his degrees, he gained early experience at Terrell State Hospital's adolescent unit. Over the years, his career took him across the country: Nebraska, Arkansas, Florida, California, Tennessee, and Texas; where he developed and directed rehabilitation programs for people with traumatic brain injuries and supported individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

In 1997, Mike shifted into counseling work full-time, completing additional coursework at Hardin-Simmons University to become a Licensed Professional Counselor. Since then, his passion has been helping individuals, adolescents, and families discover the inner strengths that enable them to heal, adapt, and thrive.

Mike describes his approach to counseling this way, "I love to be able to work with people to help them see that they have inside of them what it takes to get through the issues." His focus has often been with adolescents, individuals with intellectual disabilities, and those recovering from injury or life-altering challenges. Through his years of service, he has walked with countless clients, always seeking to point them toward hope and resilience.

Outside of counseling, Mike enjoys gardening, reading, and traveling with his wife in their RV. Family is especially important to him. He and his wife have three children and five grandchildren, with another grandchild on the way this December. Much of his joy comes from spending time with them and investing in their lives.

Mike's long and diverse career reflects both professional dedication and personal calling. His 18 years with MOCE are a testimony not only to his commitment, but also to God's faithfulness in using his gifts to bless others. We are grateful for Mike's presence in our counseling ministry and the countless lives touched through his work.



Healing Hearts Cherry Curry, Director

September has been a busy month for Healing Hearts Ministry. The West Texas Fair presented the opportunity for entries in the Crochet & Knitting category. Sally Doss, Suwanee Smith, and I entered several of our crocheted items, and we won ribbons for everything we entered. It is always fun to take part in the West Texas Fair. Most of these entries will be used as gifts for people in need of prayer.

During the month of September, we gave the following items to people within our church, or those who have some connection with our members, who are in need of prayer support:

13 Prayer cloths, 7 Prayer angels, 1 Prayer shawl, 5 Prayer throws, 2 Prayer blankets, and 6 prayer cards for a total of 34 reminders that these individuals have been in our prayers. When we have our meetings, we discuss the needs for prayer, then we each lay our hands on the item being given, pray for the recipient, and sign the card that is sent with each gift. These gifts have also been prayed over while we are making them.

For the month of October, our business meetings will be Oct. 9 & Oct. 23, and Oct. 16 will be our "Knit Along," a time when we gather to work on our projects together and sometimes learn new skills., If you are interested in helping with this ministry, we would love to have you join us.

For the month of November, we will probably only have one meeting due to my need to have surgery on my left arm on October 27. I will not know until my follow-up visit with the surgeon whether or not I can lead the meeting on November 20.
